Students are to read three short stories and complete three chapters from *Encuentros Maravillosos*. They are to answer the questions that follow each short story and complete the grammar and vocabulary exercises that accompany each story within the same chapter. ISBN# 0131163647

Students are to email the answers from the assignments in a timely manner. *Late assignments will not be accepted and will result in being dropped from the class.* Order this text immediately in order to have time to accomplish the assignments. The dates are as follows:

Story #1 due June 30, 2011, Chapter 2, pages 21-39

Story #2 due July 21, 2011, Chapter 4, pages 73-89

Story #3 due August 11, 2011, Chapter 5, pages 91-112

Students will be tested on the three short stories, the vocabulary and grammar in the second week of class in the last week of August, 2011.

The Grades from the assignments and test will be included in the first quarter grading period.

All assignments should be typed. It is not necessary to write out all grammar and vocabulary activities, only to give the numbers and answers. The punctuation and accenting should be done correctly in the typing.

For Word programs, here are the key strikes to do Spanish punctuation:

¿ - Hold down Shift, Control and Alt simultaneously and press the “?” key.

¡ - Hold down Shift, Control and Alt simultaneously and press the “1” or “!” key.

Accents- Before writing the accented vowel, hold down Control and then the apostrophe key, nothing will show but the next letter you hit will be accented.

ñ - Press and hold control, then press and hold shift, then press and hold the tilde key (next to 1 on the keyboard), in sequence and holding the three down simultaneously. Nothing will happen, but when you type “n” you will have a tilde on it.

You will need some practice to get good with the punctuation.
