Behavioral policies and procedures:

The following policies and procedures are designed so that everyone can enjoy the retreat in positive and constructive ways. Please remember that you represent Cornelia Connelly School and you are held to a high standard of behavior. These policies are in place to also keep you safe and promote good conduct while participating in activities. All adult chaperones are responsible for your safety, well-being, and conduct. You are expected to respect and cooperate with chaperones and abide by all the policies. All school policies outlined in the Parent/Student Handbook are also in effect. (An on-line version of the Parent/Student Handbook will be available on the Connelly School website prior to the retreat.) Violation of any retreat or school policy will result in disciplinary action.

- 1. Show respect by cooperating with faculty and adult chaperones at all times.
- 2. Respect your peers on the retreat, both inside and outside of planned events.
- 3. Respect the time schedules and adhere to all established curfews set by the coordinator of the retreat.
- 4. Attend all mandatory activities and meal functions.
- 5. Keep your assigned chaperone advised of your whereabouts at all times.
- 6. Comply, throughout the retreat, with any and all instructions directed to you and/or the group by a chaperone or retreat director.
- 8. Strictly follow the instructions of your chaperones for free time guidelines.
- 9. Do not consume or be in the possession of alcohol/drugs or any other illegal substance at any time.
- 10. Know that all school policies as outlined in the Student/Parent Handbook are in place for the entire duration of the retreat.
- 11. Adhere to the established dress code at all times.
- 12. Sleep in your assigned cabin and not allow members of the opposite sex in your cabin at any time.
- 13. Be in your assigned cabin at the correct time every night when your chaperones do room checks.
- 14. Keep your assigned cabin clean.

- 15. Exhibit controlled behavior and keep noise to a minimum in the cabin and throughout the retreat.
- 16. Make sure you have your belongings with you at all times and not assume that someone else has taken care of your things.
- 17. Respect everyone's property and belongings.
- 18. Refrain from speaking inappropriate language and do not engage in any activity that is disruptive, interferes with the educational aspect of the retreat, or is not in keeping with the mission and philosophy of Cornelia Connelly School.
